

1. Who is eligible to participate in the Summer Internship Programme for students?

- First-cycle (Bachelor's), second-cycle (Master's), and integrated study students are eligible to participate.
- During the internship, the student may not have any other employment relationship with the host institution, except for employment related to the internship itself.

2. Who is not eligible to participate in the Summer Internship Programme?

- Students who are in their final year of studies on the last day of the application submission deadline;
- Students who have already received funding for a summer internship under this measure in 2022 or later calls;
- Individuals who, on the last day of the application submission deadline, are enrolled in doctoral studies and/or have obtained a doctoral degree.

3. How many internship positions can a student apply for and how are priorities indicated?

A student may apply for no more than two internship positions, indicating a priority for each. If a student is ranked first in more than one internship topic, they may choose only one of them.

4. What documents are required to apply for a summer internship?

When applying, the student must complete the application form in the LMT electronic system (<https://projektai.lmt.lt/#login>) and submit the following attachments:

- Curriculum Vitae (CV);
- Certificate of academic results;
- Motivation letter.

The CV and motivation letter may be prepared in free format.

Students are encouraged to include any scientific output (e.g., publications, conference presentations), if available.

5. What are the academic performance requirements?

Students are eligible if their weighted average grade of all subjects taken in the most recent semester is at least 8.0.

The weighted average is calculated by dividing the sum of the products of ECTS credits and grades by the total number of ECTS credits.

For students from foreign higher education institutions, the weighted average must be at least 80% of the maximum possible average grade at that institution.

6. Can the certificate of academic results be submitted in a different format than the recommended one?

Yes, an official certificate issued by the higher education institution may be submitted. However, it must include all the information required in the recommended format (e.g., year of enrolment, expected graduation year, university, etc.).

7. How are student applications evaluated?

- After the application deadline (which is specified in the call and must be at least 30 calendar days), an administrative check is carried out to assess compliance with the requirements set out in the Description and the call. This check is performed by LMT staff.

If requested by LMT, the student must provide missing information, data, or documents within 2

working days from the date the notification is sent by email. If the requested information is not provided on time or is incomplete, the evaluation will be based on the information available.

Students have the right to appeal the results of the administrative check in accordance with the general rules for competitive funding.

- After the administrative check, internship supervisors are informed about the results and which students meet the requirements.

8. What is the amount of funding and eligible costs for the internship?

- Total funding per internship position – EUR 4,000:
 - EUR 1,000/month stipend or salary (net, after taxes) for the student;
 - employment-related taxes (if applicable) and other internship-related costs;
 - indirect costs not exceeding EUR 200.

or

- Total funding per internship position – EUR 4,900:
 - EUR 1,000/month stipend or salary (net, after taxes) for the student and other internship-related costs;
 - employment-related taxes (if applicable) and other internship-related costs;
 - accommodation costs (EUR 450/month) for students coming from abroad or studying in another city in Lithuania;
 - indirect costs not exceeding EUR 200.

9. What are the reporting requirements after the internship?

After completing the internship, on 26 August 2026, students must present their results at a conference organised by LMT.

In addition, by no later than 14 August 2026, students must submit a summary of the project results via email to svp@lmt.lt.

10. Are travel and visa costs covered?

11. Is accommodation provided for students?

Students are responsible for arranging their own accommodation. The host institution may assist if possible.

12. When will the summer internship take place?

The internship will take place from 1 July 2026 to 31 August 2026.

It is not possible to carry out the internship at another time.
